- Reporter
- Interpreter
- Manager
- Educator

# Feedback:

- Brief
- Timely
- Specific
- Performance based
- Balances praise and criticism
- Allows for 2-way communication
- Done in the spirit of resident success
- Private-especially if corrective



# Faculty Development: Implementation

- Initial training
- Ongoing, regular check-ins with faculty team
- Periodic workshops

# Initial Training

- Topics
  - Program specific policies and procedures
  - Orientation to overall residency curriculum
  - Expectations
  - Logistics
    - Physical location, resources required
    - Cosign notes/review documentation
    - How to give feedback
  - Skills: Teaching the adult learner

# Ongoing Regular Check-ins

- Faculty Meetings
  - How often?
  - Topics
    - Residents' goals
    - Best practice precepting
    - Ramp up/Schedule
    - Scheduling
    - Program updates

# Periodic Workshops
